




Income Tax Rates By State

Book Your Move

For best results, book your move at least two months in advance. The best way to save money is to be flexible. The demand for moving services varies from season to season, month to month, and day of the week. As a result, a move on the last Saturday of June is likely to cost more than the same move would if it were done on a weekday in mid-March. No matter what, the sooner you book, the better your price will be.

- 1. Rental buildings may require a certificate of insurance (COI) from your moving company; this offers protection against things like damage to the building elevator and dents in walls. Ask if your moving company can provide one.
- 2. Learn as much as you can about a moving company before signing a contract cancellation policies and liability coverage vary.
- 3. Select a moving company and get written confirmation of your moving date, costs, and other details.

How To Verify A USDOT Number

When moving across state lines, confirm that the mover is registered with the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration and has a U.S. Department of Transportation (USDOT) number. You can verify their USDOT number by searching this database.



Label Boxes And Create An Inventory List

There are two standard approaches to packing, basic box labeling, and comprehensive inventory lists. In either case, it is good to clearly label boxes that contain fragile or heavy items.

Basic – As you pack your belongings, use markers or labels to clearly indicate the contents of each box and the room it will go to in your new home. This will eamline the unpacking process and help movers know where to place each box upon arrival.

Comprehensive – If you want to know where everything is as soon as the moving truck is unloaded, you should use a more comprehensive system to pack. As you pack each box, note all of the contents on an inventory list. Each box will have a number which will also be on the box label. This method helps you maintain control over your belongings throughout the move and minimize the risk of misplaced or lost items. When traveling overseas, it is recommended that you limit the labels on the outside of the box to a number and the total number of boxes such 15 of 60.
